What Does That Look Like at Regis?

- Communicate with teachers
 - Email, phone call, attend conferences, volunteer
- PS Learning, PS Learning, PS Learning
- Get grade reports from PowerSchool
- Look at student planners (or their iPads for 8th graders)
- Be involved
- Post a calendar at home
- Talk to your child
 - Ask them about their day
 - What is happening at school and their classes
