Stuart Bailey Scholarship Forms for 8th Graders Going to Xavier DUE MONDAY!

As a reminder to our 8th grade students/families, please remember to take advantage of a special scholarship opportunity available for those students attending Xavier next year. The **Stuart Bailey Scholarship** is an award that is in memory of a former All Saints/Regis High School student, Stuart Bailey. The Bailey family offers a scholarship for a future Xavier student, and all Regis 8th Graders who will be attending Xavier are eligible to apply. Students have access to this information on PS Learning.

Stuart Bailey believed strongly in furthering himself through education. He was a student who loved life and was involved in many activities, both in school and church. This award will be given to a student who believes in these goals and who is willing and able to write an essay about them.

Students who wish to apply for this award should list specific examples of why you would be a worthy candidate, citing both your involvement in school and in church. It is important however, that students do NOT include their name or parish in the actual essay portion. The deadline for completion of the essay is **THIS COMING Monday, May 13th at 8 am**. Cafeteria News

As we near the end of the school year sometimes there is a reluctance to put too much money into your students' lunch account. Please know that any money left over will be held for the next school year or, in the case of the 8th graders, sent on to Xavier for their lunches there. If your 8th-grade student is not going to Xavier please email me, ncanfield@regisroyals.org, and I will have it sent to you or, if a small amount, it can be donated to the lunch program to help others pay their delinquent accounts. Starting Monday we will have thirteen (13) school lunch days left. At \$2.95 a meal, a student will need \$38.35 for the rest of the year in order to cover ONLY a hot lunch. This is not including any a la carte items that your student may buy, and most students spend an average of \$1.50 per day on ala carte.
